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KEMPINSKI DROPS ANCHOR IN THE CARIBBEAN

The hotel group announced the development of its first property in the region, the Cabrits Resort Kempinski Dominica.



Kempinski targets the Caribbean market. The Swiss hotel group announced the signature of an agreement with the Dominican government to build a luxury hotel on the island. The project is part of the Citizenship By Investment program that allows foreign investors to obtain the Domincan nationality by investing 200,000 dollars.

Kempinski is also preparing its foray into the Caribbean where it has yet to open a property. Named the Cabrits Resort Kempinski Dominica, the luxury hotel currently under construction will open to the north of the island, on Douglas Bay in Cabrits. It will have 101 rooms and suites.

On January 1, 2014, Kempinski was 43th hotel group worldwide in terms of number of rooms, according to the ranking realized each year by MKG Hospitality, hospitality consulting firm founded by Georges Panavotis. It had an international portfolio of 74 hotels and 19.564 rooms. (Read our report)
