Range Developments and Kempinski will soon offer an internship programme fro state college students.



The announcement was made at the ground breaking for the Cabrits Resort Kempinski Dominica on Friday, October 16th.

The new five star resort will be part of a chain of 76 other Kempinski luxury hotels and will be constructed by Range Developments.

President of Kempinski, Xavier Destribats described the internship programme.

"I think it's important to leverage the network of Kempinski...so what we will get some

young students getting [a chance] to work in Europe, the Middle East [or] China in order to get acquainted with Kempinski's flair and learning what [we] are all about and what we would like to do here.

"Those students would be brought back for the opening of the hotel because it is important for us to work with the local environment and the local people as well."

Hon. Tourism Minister, Senator Robert Tonge added that a list of students is currently being compiled.

Another aspect of the offer from Range Developments involves a mini hotel for DSC students.

Hon. Tonge referenced a conversation with Range Vice President, Mohammed Asaria.

"He made a promise to the Dominica State College to assist with the training and education of our people by providing what I consider to be a mini facility to assist with the education and training of persons at the State College."

The Hon. Minister, on Dominica's behalf, appreciates the company's contribution to social development.

"Range is not just all about profitability, they are also about social responsibility. They are ensuring that they can give back and help us lift our people. Thank you very much."

Work on the five star luxury Cabrits Resort Kempinski Dominica is expected to end in the first quarter of 2018.
